



currency swap is a foreign exchange agreement between two parties to exchange aspects, namely the principal and interest payments, of a loan in one currency for equivalent aspects of an equal in net present value loan in another currency. Currency swaps are motivated by comparative advantage. Generally, a swap that involves the exchange of principal and interest in one currency for the same in another currency is considered to be a foreign exchange transaction and not required by law to be shown on the balance sheet. Since the exchange of payments takes place in two different currencies, the prevailing spot rate is used to calculate that payment amount. This financial instrument is used to hedge interest rate risks......
